## No organised fireworks this year on Bonfire Night

Fundraising before the event is also critical. ### **Walberswick Common Lands Charity**

#### **Action on the Common**

As many of you know, the Common is a Site of Special Scientific Interest designated by the Department for Environment, Food & Rural Affairs. The Common Lands Charity owns and manages it in partnership with Natural England. The Area Officer, Ed Boyle, joined us for a review recently. He also brought his colleagues from across Suffolk and Norfolk for a visit to see the mosaic of vegetation that has been crafted over many years, creating a number of priority habitats and supporting an increasing number of key species.

A new aspect of this work is the creation of some bare earth sites that are crucial in the creation of habitats for invertebrates (for example butterflies and moths) and reptile species. We are spot on with the timing of this work in early autumn as it is before reptiles (for example adders, grass snakes, common lizards and slow worms) begin hibernating. Paul and Rob have fine tuned the process and work is now underway.

## Walberswick Neighbourhood Development Plan update

The work on developing a Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) for Walberswick, which is being overseen by the Parish Council, has continued apace since the last update. A NDP is the only document the Parish can use that has legal standing in the East Suffolk District Council Planning Process, and it will help protect those aspects of the village that we all love most from inappropriate development. Analysis of the results of the Housing Needs Survey that went to all households in June has been completed, and work on both the built and green spaces in and around the village has been carried out. A number of sections of the document are now at 'first draft' stage and will be available at another drop-in session at the Heritage Hut on the weekend of 3 & 4 December. This will provide an opportunity both to see the work completed so far and to comment/provide input on a number of aspects that will help shape the development of the final document.
